Lanterns for our Chinese New Year Celebration Week

The last two weeks...

We enjoyed a four day week last week with a day off for President's Day. Upon our return to school, we turned our focus to President's Day and a few of the Presidents of the United States and read books about George Washington and Abraham Lincoln and their accomplishments. The children built "log cabins" from popsicle sticks, observed American coins and created crayon rubbings, and played a heads & tails matching game. The Lunar and Chinese New Year fell on Thursday, February 19th. Sabrina's parents, EJ & Chia-Li visited to share their

story of the Chinese New Year. Ask your Big Bear to retell their remembering of the thrilling story-it should include the color red and fireworks! EJ then set up a writing/drawing activity where the children could practice making Chinese symbols on red paper to hang at home to "frighten the monster, Nian" away that appears on Chinese New Year. The class also decorated a shirt to wear to bed to celebrate the holiday.

This week we continued to focus on the Chinese New Year and Chinese culture. Louis' family shared dragon's head masks (or lion's masks) that could be worn on Chinese New Year in celebration, to represent Nian. The class has been collectively working on a paper mache project that will become our dragon's mask to wear in a school parade on Monday. Ms. Betsy brought in her rice cooker from home and the children assisted her in making white and black rice, which we ate during snack on Tuesday. We colored uncooked rice with food coloring and rubbing alcohol in ziploc bags and then used this colored rice to create rice collages on cardboard.
